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Operational Applications

Research tools, procedures, or systems in which definitions, categories, or structures from the Encyclopedia are operationalised for annotation, identification, classification, coding, or other systematic analysis.

BALAGHA Score

The [BALAGHA Score](#) [↗], a numeric scoring system for quantifying the density of rhetorical devices in Arabic texts. It uses the [Arabic Rhetorical Device Taxonomy](#) enable the systematic annotation and analysis of rhetorical devices across texts and datasets.

AraMIP: Arabic Metaphor Identification Procedure

The [Metaphor](#), [Simile](#), and [Implicit Reference \(Kināyah\)](#) definitions developed in the Encyclopedia are operationalised in the [Arabic Metaphor Identification Procedure \(AraMIP\)](#) [↗], a two-stage procedure for identifying and annotating metaphor and related figurative phenomena in Arabic text.^[1]

Empirical Applications

Research resources and studies in which the Encyclopedia's taxonomy is used to annotate corpora, quantify rhetorical phenomena, compare texts, or generate empirical findings.

The Balagha Corpus

The [Balagha Corpus](#) [↗] is a corpus developed for the systematic annotation and quantitative analysis of rhetorical devices using the [Arabic Rhetorical Device Taxonomy](#) and its associated coding system.

Extensions and Evaluations

Research which evaluates, validates, extends, modifies, or systematically maps the Encyclopedia's taxonomy or its underlying analytical framework.
